Introduction

The Forest & Climate Leaders' Partnership (FCLP), launched at COP27, is a high-ambition group of 33 governments that are committed to work together to drive global ambition to support the delivery of the 2030 target to halt and reverse forest loss and land degradation.

The Platform to Support Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities in Forest Climate Action was launched at COP28 by a group of governments, donors from the Forest Tenure Funders Group, and indigenous organisations including the Global Alliance for Territorial Communities. Norway and Peru are leading the development of the Platform.

After several months of discussions between experts, they have recommended that the platform participants are well placed to deliver two outcomes, which are closely interlinked:

- 1. Policy action at national level: By 2030 the Platform has supported at least six tropical forest countries¹ to advance in: (1) shifting policies to strengthen forest tenure rights and secure a path towards zero deforestation and zero violence in IP and LC territories, and/or (2) redirecting or increasing finance flows towards more positive outcomes for IP & LCs, and/or (3) developing and strengthening more inclusive climate governance² models at the national/regional level.
- 2. Policy action at global level: Between 2024 and 2030, the Platform has regularly contributed to increased high-level political attention on IP and LC issues raised by IP and LC organizations and FCLP country members, utilizing regional and geopolitical opportunities to influence decision-making and political (including donors) agendas.

To deliver on agreed outcomes, the Platform participants can use a combination of the following key tools and approaches, as required: (1) Exchange of experiences and best practices; (2) Working with the international community to catalyse finance, efficiency and impact in countries and regions; (3) Communications and political awareness; (4) Hexagonal coordination; (5) Alliance building and identifying opportunities.



Platform outcomes, outputs and activities

Outcome 1

By 2030 the Platform has supported at least 6 tropical forests countries to advance in: (1) shifting polices to strengthen forest tenure rights and secure a path towards zero deforestation and zero violence in IP&LC territories and/or (2) redirecting or increasing finance flows towards more positive outcomes for IPs and LCs and/or (3) developing and strengthening more inclusive climate governance models at the national/regional level.

Output 1A: Platform participants have supported dialogue and ambition on more direct Indigenous Peoples and local communities funding and have outlined ways forward to incentivize the use of local/IP and LC funds to support IP and LC initiatives.

These country priorities have been outlined to some degree already. For example:

- Peru is interested in donor influence over REDD Indigenous, direct funding, and promoting inclusive governance in national mechanisms such as PROFONANPE.
- Costa Rica is interested in funding (1) a process to design instruments to improve PAFS, Forests Action Plans to be linked with the new Land Tenure Law., and (2) Capacity building for communities receiving money for the first time directly.
- Ecuador is interested in developing the administrative procedure to apply the law that allow IPLCs to access land tittles in National Protected Areas. This could include technical and legal support, mapping and other geographical and technological support, political support.
- Colombia, Ghana and DRC still need to conduct an internal dialogue to define national priorities to bring to the Platform.
- Kenya is interested in working in a capacity building on self-determination for communities that must decide about carbon projects.
- GATC has raised the topics of people on voluntary isolation and protection to environmental defenders. More discussions should happen to figure out the interest of countries or regions (E.g. Amazon Basin) to work in these topics.

This Output C requires further discussions and deliberation by Platform participants. The types of proposals that have been discussed to date include supporting development of the following at either a technical or political level:

- Inclusive governance principles.
- Benefit sharing principles and inclusion.
- Support strategies on the protection of environmental defenders.

Support policies to protect indigenous populations in voluntary isolation.
